years earlier (April 30, 1341), Brittany, left without a direct heir, was torn apart by the War of Succession. Two claimants faced each other: on one side, Jean de Montfort, supported by England; on the other, Charles de Blois, who sought to attach Brittany to the Kingdom of France.

The country was thus divided into two camps, and war broke out. Ploërmel rallied to Jean de Montfort, while Josselin remained loyal to Charles de Blois. In 1351, Ploërmel housed a Montfortist garrison commanded by Bembro, captain of the fortress.

At Josselin, Charles de Blois's cause was defended by a garrison led by Jean de Beaumanoir, captain of the city and Marshal of Brittany. Bembro's garrison soon began ravaging and pillaging the countryside around Ploërmel.

Indignant at these atrocities, Jean de Beaumanoir went to confront his adversary and declared:

"We must put an end to these raids! The people suffer from our wars. The peasants sow the wheat that feeds us—let us spare them. May God be our judge! Let us choose thirty or forty champions and settle our quarrel through arms."

Bembro accepted the challenge. Thus, on March 26, 1351, before a vast crowd gathered around the great Mi-Voie oak, the two camps prepared for a confrontation that would remain legendary in Breton memory: one of the highest feats of arms in the region's history.

Jean de Beaumanoir chose thirty valiant Bretons.

Bembro, for his part, assembled twenty Englishmen, six
Germans, and four Bretons.

The two forces faced each other, sizing each other up, then retreated... before charging headlong. The clash was terrible, and soon the mêlée became chaotic: a fierce struggle in the crush of combat.

Two Bretons fell, and three others were wounded and taken prisoner. The fighting paused briefly to catch their breath, then resumed with renewed ferocity. Bembro was killed; his lieutenant, Crokart, took command. Four of his men perished in turn. The ground ran red with blood.

Beaumanoir, gravely wounded, staggered. Thirst tormented him, and he asked for water. One of his companions then shouted words that would become famous:

"Drink your blood, Beaumanoir, and your thirst will pass!"

Revived by this exhortation, Beaumanoir threw himself again upon the enemy. Guillaume de Montauban mounted his horse and struck the English with irresistible fury.

In the end, the Bretons claimed victory. They mourned only three dead, while twelve enemies were slain, and the survivors were left wounded and scarred.

This battle became legendary, passed down through generations. For a long time, people would say of any bravely fought fight:

"We fought as at the Combat of the Thirty."

the year 2026, the Tournoi des Trente celebrates its twenty-fourth edition.

Faithful to its noble ideal, it has pursued the same quest since its very beginnings: to bring together the most valiant rugby schools, from France and the Celtic nations, to rejoice together in Breton and Celtic traditions, and to honor rugby in all its greatness.

In this adventure, the Tournoi des Trente rises as a true stronghold of fraternity, relying on the valor of its servants: volunteer knights, devoted coaches, and gallant rugby players, all united in defending and exalting the spirit of rugby.



Remember: Bravery, Brotherhood, Zeal, and Respect are the cardinal virtues of every knight... and of every rugby player worthy of the name.

During your stay in Breton lands, you will discover a country of many faces and epic landscapes: from the dark Black Mountains to the mysterious Brocéliande forest, from the luminous Gulf of Morbihan to the warrior harbor of Lorient. Here, in the heart of Celtic lands, every stone and every tree carries the memory of legends—now it is your turn to inscribe your own.

Game in the form of "contact rugby 7x7" on a 56m x 45m pitch.


